Dear Resident, As the Police and Crime Commissioner for Gwent it is my responsibility to ensure that you have appropriate levels of policing. This involves preparing and setting the annual budget which includes the police element of your council tax (known as the police precept).

determinina the budaet 2016/17, I have taken into account the Chief Constable's requirements to deliver operational policing – the cost of which accounts for the majority of my police and crime budget. The remainder of my budget is then used to commission services from

deliver against my Police and Crime Plan priorities.

As a result of a significant reduction in Central Government grants to frontline policing over the last five years and continuing future cuts, Gwent Police will potentially face a deficit of £64 million between the period 2008/09 to 2020/21. To date, the policing service in Gwent has delivered over £37 million of efficiency savings to address this gap, resulting in losing over 300 police officers and a similar amount of staff.

To partially offset the remaining impact of this funding gap, whilst being mindful of the difficulties residents are going through in these times of austerity, I have decided to set the increase on the police precept on residential properties at 3.99% for 2016/17. This means that the average Gwent household (Band D properties) will pay an additional 16 pence a week for their policing and related services in 2016/17.

providers outside of Gwent Police, to In return, this increase will enable Gwent Police to achieve a balanced budget this year and to recruit up to 100 much-needed frontline officers over the next 2 to 3 years. This ensures that the Force can continue to meet the demands of modern day policing and keep you safe. This produces a challenging but achievable budget to deliver my police and crime priorities.
