

# Volunteer Role Title: Youth Justice Volunteer

# Aim of volunteering role:

To work in the Youth Offending Service, a group of paid staff and volunteers who work with children and young people (aged 10-17 years) to prevent offending and re-offending.

# Tasks:

- 1. To supervise and support young people to carry out activities in the community to repair the harm caused by their offending behaviour.
- 2. To work with young people, parents/carers and victims to agree a contract of activities to address offending behaviour.
- 3. To act as appropriate adult for young people in the Police Station to safeguard their welfare and rights.
- 4. To record and feedback all relevant information to the Youth Offending Service.
- 5. Ensure that safeguarding procedures are adhered to.

# NB Volunteers can express an interest in preferred tasks

#### Time:

Flexible time commitment including availability during evenings/weekends.

#### Place of work:

The majority of activities will take place in the communities of Monmouthshire & Torfaen. Appropriate adult duties will require travel to Newport and Ystrad Mynach.

#### Volunteer manager:

Karen McCorriston, Senior Reparation Officer.

#### Transport needed:

Volunteers will require access to a car and business use.

# N.B if volunteers are only interested in task 2 the above does not apply but volunteers will need to provide their own transport.

#### Skills/attributes required:

- 1. Interest in and commitment to support the rehabilitation of children and young people who offend or are at risk of offending.
- 2. Ability to engage and communicate with young people who may display challenging behaviours.
- 3. Willingness to be involved in outdoor community projects (only applies to task 1).
- 4. Ability to make common sense judgements.
- 5. Ability to communicate appropriately with young people, parents/carers, members of the community, professionals and project providers.
- 6. A sense of humour, flexibility and a team player.

#### Benefits offered:

- 1. Induction training. Attendance is mandatory.
- 2. Additional, 'in house' training on a variety of topics
- 3. Tools provided
- 4. Expenses paid
- 5. Full insurance cover
- 6. Volunteer recognition events
