Wentwood remains a haven for wildlife. In spring you can wander along the paths surrounded by carpets of bluebells and listen to a harmony of bird song. The nightjar can often be heard, and if you stay alert you might be able to spot a dormouse, adder, lizard or deer. The wood ant can also be found at Wentwood, though very tiny it has a big presence. Look out for their nests (mounds on the ground) that stand 3-4 ft high – though don't be tempted to sit on them!

We are restoring parts of Wentwood to its natural native broadleaved woodland. You will be able to enjoy the trees, plants and animals that are associated with this important habitat. This is a long term and ambitious plan, but nature is our side. Although most of the native trees were felled, the seeds from those that still remain and other woodland species will soon regenerate to create timber for the remaining native woodland.

Wentwood was one of the first woods in the UK to be planted with conifer trees as far back as the 1700s. Since then, and especially during the first and second world wars, Wentwood has been one of its past industrial uses. 

