Kerbcraft is a programme dedicated to ensuring all children learn how to be safe while crossing the road, using practical training methods to improve kerbside skills and raise awareness of traffic

During the Autumn Term, 224 of the children across Monmouthshire have taken part in the kerbcraft programme, a fantastic achievement!

They have all had practical experience at the roadside of practising and discussing how important

it is to stop at the kerb, look correctly and be able to see where traffic is coming from before crossing the road.

Parents of one child said.

“We have noticed a definite improvement in our son’s behaviour near roads since he has taken part in Kerbcraft.

He now stops at kerbs, looks and waits to be told it’s safe to cross and no longer runs out into the road without thinking.

It’s made going out with him a lot safer.”

By the end of term, all the children who have completed the scheme will have received a certificate and a high vis bag to use, to help them be seen at the roadside.

At Osbaston we have had a busy first term to the school year. Road Safety Week

A massive thank you to all the schools that took part in Road Safety Week in November. With 7 schools taking part and running poster competitions, awareness days and road safety workshops, we definitely raised the profile of road safety in Monmouthshire! Please see some highlights of the week below:

Castle Park and Archbishop Rowan Williams CIW schools took part in Road Safety week by accessing Road Safety Workshops based on 'being safe around your community.' Over 100 children access the sessions, each contributing with thoughtful discussions and suggestions on how to be safe!

Trellech and Goytre Fawr ran poster competitions based on #speeddownsaveslives throughout the week with some fantastic posters created by all children!

At Durand Primary School during Road Safety Week we ran a competition for "speed down save lives". We showed a powerpoint in assembly on Road Safety and spoke to the school about the importance of the campaign. We asked pupils to design a poster to tell adults to slow down because there are children nearby. We chose two winners from Foundation Phase and two winners Key Stage Two and we awarded prizes to the winners. We have laminated the winning posters and displayed the posters in the parent car park.
