Fortnightly Collections



Household Rubbish, Nappy and Hygiene Waste

- Fortnightly rubbish collection is still limited to two bags.
- Yellow bags are for nappy and hygiene waste only.
- For discretion, we can collect yellow bags from inside a small dustbin.
- This waste is sent to an 'energy from waste' facility in Cardiff where it is used to generate electricity.

New Glass Recycling Box

- Your new glass recycling box has been delivered.
- Clean glass bottles and jars will be collected every fortnight.
- Keeping our glass separate will help us to improve the quality and value of all our recycling
- Glass is sent to a reprocessing facility in Cwmbran where it is recycled into fibreglass and new bottles.

Weekly Collections



Recycling in Red and Purple Bags

- Red and purple bags will be kept separate in new split back vehicles.
- We will no longer be able to collect bags that contain glass.
- This will help to improve the quality of the recycling we collect.
- Our recycling is sent to a local sorting plant before being transported to re-processors to be recycled into new products.

Weekly Collections



Food Waste in Blue Bin

- Food waste is collected separately.
- It is sent to a facility in Bridgend that turns food waste into electricity and liquid fertilizer.
- Old plastic bags (bread bags etc.) can now be reused as food waste caddy liners.
- The bags are removed during this process and are sent to Cardiff's 'energy from waste' facility.

Garden Waste Recycling

- Seasonal garden waste collections operate from the beginning of March to the end of November.
- You can register and pay for the garden waste service from February. Visit monmouthshire.gov.uk
- Please do not mix kitchen food waste with garden waste.
- Garden waste is sent to a local farm in Abergavenny to be turned into compost.
