Evaluation of survey

Monmouthshire County Council launched a survey for residents and visitors to help inform the Monmouthshire Toilet Strategy. The survey was available from December 2018 – January 2019.

- Morrison's supermarket have good baby change facilities otherwise I have to change my child in my boot
- "Public toilets are needed in Raglan there is a lot of passing through traffic including cyclists & the village is large enough to warrant these facilities without the extra housing applications that have been submitted for the village.
- The toilets in Brewery Yard are good.
- Usk have very good facilities."
- "Excellent facilities in Pembrokeshire suggest you look at this
- Since you closed everything!!!!"
- Local Toilet closed and sold
 In my experience private toilets are far superior to public ones.
- Abergavenny bus station toilets usually good at start of the day. Usk varies
- Good facilities in Welsh Street, Castle Car Park, By the riverbank and at Thomas Street in Chepstow
- In Abergavenny the toilet facilities I use most often is in Castle Street car park and these are clean and well maintained.
- Majority of cafes/pubs/restaurants have good facilities in Abergavenny particularly the Grofield, Coffee Pot, Nicholls
- The toilets behind the market are most used. My husband uses all the public toilets as he goes around town because of his prostrate problem. I have a bladder problem which means I too need public toilets often. These facilities are essential for older people.
- Those behind Abergavenny Market
- None are outstanding. Nicholls are good, and The Angel, but would only use if eating / drinking there - so rarely available for use. The Tithe barn cafe too, but that has closed?
- Brewery Yard good
- Castle car park adequate
- Only the library and leisure centre offer anything like suitable changing facilities
- Waitrose
- None are very good, only Waitrose is good for a toilet but for changing young babies everywhere is poor
- Toilets in Castle car park.

- new toilets in Brewers Yard are clean and well maintained
- I don't want to have to buy something to use a WC, so council-provided facilities are super-important. Abergavenny public WCs but the Castle car park are ok.
- I visit the public toilets near the Market Hall in Abergavenny. I don't have small children nor am I disabled so I'm not sure about these facilities, but the toilet facilities that I use are adequate during business hours.
- Tapas bar in Frogmore Street, Angel Hotel, King's Arms all in Abergavenny
- All seem the same I Abergavenny
- "Behind the Market Hall in Abergavenny are good
- White Horse Lane ones are older and feel less clean"
- Weatherspoon's in Abergavenny
- The ones by the market and bus station are necessary and mostly just adequate.
- Toilets at the rear of the market pretty good but always significant difficulty accessing disabled. Baby changing across Aber poor.
- As usual the local Wetherspoons provide the best facilities.
- Toilets are generally not too bad, just need updating in a few such as bus station and white horse lane
- Morrisons, Abergavenny. Good job they are there with Bailey Park toilets not open when you need them.
- "Morrison's has great toilets; there are rarely queues, they are modern and clean. We have a young child and they use the baby changing toilet.
- Cafe Neros has a baby changing facility which we have used. Also
 Weatherspoon's. But I do not know of anywhere else that would let you go in
 and use the toilet unless you were a customer. "
- All public toilets in Abergavenny need to be there. They also need updating.
- The Wetherspoons pub toilets.
- All the public toilets in Abergavenny are 'OK' none are great... but I'm grateful
 for them when I need them. They're reasonably maintained and as clean as
 you'd expect for unmanned facilities. Privately run toilets are usually (a bit)
 better but I only use these if I am genuinely a customer of the supermarket or
 pub that day.
- The new toilets by the market hall
- The best is Waitrose; the public toilets are rudimentary at best.
- Brewery yard toilets
- Weatherspoon's
- Morrisons
- None are of "good quality" probably the best are those found in the supermarkets

Chepstow

- Good facilities in Welsh Street, Castle Car Park, By the riverbank and at Thomas Street in Chepstow
- The toilets in the car park next to the library in Chepstow are always clean.
- M&S
- The hub Chepstow and Monmouth when open
- Chepstow toilets in car parks are adequate. Less decent in library car park.
- The public toilets by the car park on Welsh St are not adequate, especially for babies and older people, the best ones are in Tesco
- I have used the baby changing facilities in Chepstow and Monmouth libraries and am very glad of them. They are clean and safe.
- Generally clean. Warm in library.

Monmouth

• I only use the toilets in Waitrose as find the public toilets unacceptable.

Caldicot

- The library toilets are adequate but the library hours vary so not very convenient
- The toilets always clean at the castle in Caldicot.

- Public toilets are needed in Raglan there is a lot of passing through traffic

- Usk have very good facilities."
- You closed the public toilets in Raglan of course I imagine u may need to revisit that if u build 160 new houses

What could be better?

- Please provide details of any poor quality toilet and changing facilities that are available in the town or village centre that you visit most often.
- Abergavenny
- All are poor quality. Few bins provided for hygiene waste and those which are, are often overflowing.
- Although the toilet block in Main Street has recently been redecorated externally, the interior facilities are very basic and would benefit from improvement. The Gents has no baby changing provision.
- toilets often unflushed

- Basic is better that nothing in an emergency!
- Whitehorse Lane more about state of building than issues with facilities.
 Frequent sewage smells in toilet in Brewery Yard.
- Most of the toilets I visit in Abergavenny infrequently and so cannot comment on these.
- The facilities are Spartan
- Public toilets on White Horse Lane in Abergavenny are particularly poor. It
 would be more effective to close these and re-direct the appropriate resources
 to improve the other 3 Public Toilet facilities in the town.
- The toilets at the post office car park in Abergavenny and the one near Cibi Walk are awful. The facilities for grandchildren is very bad.
- Abergavenny Bus Station; White Horse Lane, Abergavenny
- Toilet in the alley by the leather handbags shop is scruffy but it is the most useful when shopping.
- White Horse Lane lavatories stink and ruin the area.
- I am interested in toilet facilities, and am fortunate enough not to require 'changing facilities', whatever those might be.
- White Horse Lane and Bus Station Car Park toilets need redecorating and modernising
- Public toilet facilities are poor; cramped and cold
- Very few places available and not very nice facilities esp. for young children.
 Very difficult with a wheel chair
- Toilets near Cibi walk.
- main issue is lack of access for wheelchair users rather than poor quality per se
- In need of upgrading Whitehorse lame
- White Horse Lane and Bus station toilets are grubby and shut early evening. Castle Street are better but again shut early evening.
- Abergavenny bus station
- Near the lane close to Cibi Walk. Shabby and not very clean
- The public toilets near to the tobacconists
- Very much needed facility which attracts people to stop in the town.
- Many of the public toilets are difficult to access if you are disabled in any way, they are cold and damp and have nowhere to put your things while you go.
- Toilets at the rear of Ciba shopping centre poor, vital but need some love.
 Disabled and baby provision poor across Aber
- Tudor street Abergavenny
- Most of the public facilities are poor, e.g. Tudor Street. But that is better than nothing.
- I would never take my child into the public toilets next to Cibi walk as the last time I was in they were disgusting. I don't know if they have baby changing. I do not know of any shop with a toilet/baby changing facility apart from the ones listed in the previous answer. If there are any they are not well known, which is a nuisance when you have a small child about to wet themselves looking for a toilet. We have taken her into the public toilets next to the market

- a few times out of desperation but they are always messy and not good for young children.
- White horse lane Bus station
- The toilets near Cibi Walk need updating, not removing. They need to be there. As do all the others
- The council toilets in the car park near the bus station and I tried to access the other public toilets but they had closed.
- None are too bad that I would avoid using them.
- The toilets by Cibbi walk are disgusting and are known locally as the smelly toilets or where the local heroin addicts go to smoke their drugs!
- I only use the post office ones and there's no baby change
- Baileys Park Abergavenny
- Whitehorse Lane toilets leave a lot to be desired
- Cibi walk and bailey park have toilets which could do with money spent on them they are very popular

Chepstow

- Chepstow Public Toilets (no change facilities) and Chepstow library (needs refurbishing)
- Haven't found one that can cope with toddler and baby in pram
- Library car park toilets could be improved
- The public toilets by the bandstand at Chepstow riverside are horrific, with baby changing only available to those with a radar key for the disabled toilet. This is an important tourist spot as well as for the local community and needs to be improved.
- Poor cleanliness of public toilets

Monmouth

- The two council ones are very basic and unwelcoming, floors seem perpetually wet.

Residents were asked to provide details of any issues that are happening in Monmouthshire. Below are the most common themes that emerged.

1. Cleanliness of toilets

- My main issue is cleanliness and comfort. There is only one public toilet in Abergavenny that I feel comfortable using, and that is the one behind the Market.
- Please think about those who need to go to the toilet frequently life is very
 difficult for those who have poor control of their bladders and/or bowels. The
 provision of facilities is very important. They need to be there, accessible and
 clean.
- Insufficient; poorly lit; cold; inadequate facilities; sometimes lacking toilet paper, soap and towels.
- Lack of information, early closing, running out of toilet tissue and soap.
- "They are not clean and they look a disgrace inside.
- No one seems to be looking after them in the daytime
- The newest one (for men) by the market in Abergavenny, had a pong from day one that takes your breath away
- The others are so unpleasant and run down you want to close your eyes.
- I wouldn't mind paying a small amount for a clean wall, nice tiles and a clean floor and a clean smell.
- The drawback you know there is a charge and don't have the right change."
- They are dirty
- Outdated and filthy public toilets by Cibi Walk, messy toilets by indoor market,
- We need more and more updated ones
- Inadequate cleaning. Floors often dirty. Washing facilities basic, often no hot water. Dryers are useless. No alternative paper towels provided.

2. A desire for general improvement

- Public toilets are unattractive and old fashioned in general. I can't think of any that are different. I use the ones at the top of the town (Chepstow) but would avoid most others I can think of.
- Generally the standard of toilets in Monmouthshire is poor. When I worked for the NHS travelling around in the community I was often using public toilets.
 There were not enough and of a very poor standard.
- They need to be considered an essential part of a good infrastructure. How can people use the town properly if there are no decent toilets
- AS A VISITOR TO AN AREA GOOD TOILET FACILITIES ARE A BASIC REQUIREMENT, IT MAY NOT STOP ME VISITING AN AREA FOR THE FIRST TIME, BUT IT WOULD PUT ME OFF A REPEAT TRIP
- It is essential that toilet facilities are available especially to encourage visitors to the area. Clear signage, clean toilets and accessibility are important for the image of a welcoming county.

- The council ones in Monmouth are not very pleasant but better than nothing. It's a pity there isn't the scheme like in East Herts where shops etc display signs saying you can use their facilities.
- I don't think it's fair to expect private businesses to provide toilet facilities to non-customers. I don't want charges because some people can't afford it.
 Maybe a mix of new enhanced 'charged' facilities and keep existing free but basic facilities
- MCC should fund rather than TCs.

3. Not enough changing facilities

- There should be provision of toilet, changing and disabled toilets in several areas of the towns. In Gilwern there are only public toilets in the top of the village on the high street and none at all that I know of in the bottom end of the village where the school, library and children's swings are.
- I struggle to find toilets and or changing facilities wherever I visit, perhaps they exist and a few signs might be helpful.
- Monmouthshire is a better county for toilets than Powys
- Baby changing facilities are poor, toilets may be available but are too few.
 Chepstow and an example is either right at the top in the library car park or at the extreme bottom by the river (I'm not even sure if these are open all the time). If you are not fit and active or have young children then this is very inconvenient if not impossible
- Disabled toilets you need to change on the floor, not acceptable!!
- No information anywhere about where to take small child when they need to go or when nappy needs changed.
- Not enough baby change facilities
- There is a distinct lack of changing places for people with disabilities

4. The number of Toilets

- Number of toilets in Abergavenny is just about adequate for adults but not for baby changing and the elderly. Elsewhere provision is worse. Tourism is an important industry for Monmouthshire and their needs are going to be great than local residents'.
- Apart from the fact that there are not enough public toilets anywhere,
- "The toilet facilities in the main streets are spread out appropriately for shoppers. Any closures would cause a problem.
- (I never use the new toilets behind the market as I do not shop in the market.)"
- Not enough
- I had a child with a hyperactive bladder, I felt that the toilets care in Abergavenny was very good but that they needed one in the main park

(Baileys) this has recently been reopened and despite feeling a bit grotty it is still very useful having toilets in the park. I also suffer from IBS so it is very useful to have toilets open around town.

Lack of them

Some of the other issues that were talked about:

- More signposting is needed in the county
- Drug use in toilets
- Train Stations

What would be the best way for you to find out where the nearest toilet and changing facilities are in the county?

64% of those who responded said they would like to see a sticker or poster in shop windows to identify where facilities are available

27% of those who responded liked the idea of an **App to identify your nearest** toilet.

13% said they would like other methods such as a visible map in towns or villages or they were happy to ask people.

What provision would you like to see implemented in the future?

40% suggest private providers actively encourage non customers to use their facilities

36% suggest close certain public blocks to provide better maintenance and facilities for those who continue

23% Suggest the local authority seek further investment to improve current public toilet provision
