



# Landscape and visual sensitivity to housing High/Medium

The susceptibility of the area area lies in its location largely away from existing settlement to the north, the rising slopes above and intervisible with the levels, the skylines within the area seen from various points, the distinctive woodlands to the south of the area with associated traditional pastures, the local focus of Heston Brake Long Barrow which is locally accessible and the distinctive dispersed linear pattern of Leechpool and the traditional farm complex at Ruffets. The value of the area lies in Heston Brake Long Barrow and standing stones which are a SM, the SSSI and SINC woodlands and the PROW through the area to the south. LANDMAP value is outstanding for cultural landscape and high for historic landscape.
