# TRAFFIC REGULATION AND SPEED LIMIT ORDER 2019

Monmouthshire County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of its powers under sections 1, 2, 4, 29, 32, 33, 34, 35, 45, 46, 46A, 47, 49, 53, 63, 82, 83, 84, 124 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984) and Part 6 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 2004") and after consultation with the Chief Officer of South Wales Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the following Order (hereinafter referred to as "this Order"):

#### 1. GENERAL

- 1.1 This Order is called the "Monmouthshire County Council Traffic Regulation and Speed Limit Order 2019" and shall come into operation on the 30th day of May 2019.
- 1.2 Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.
- 1:3 Any reference in this Order to any article or schedule shall be construed as a reference to an article or as the case may be a schedule of this Order.
- 1.4 The interpretation Act, 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament and as if for the purpose of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Orders revoked by article 1.6 and amended by article 1.7 of this Order were Acts of Parliament thereby repeated.
- 1.5 The prohibitions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any Regulations or Orders made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984, or by or under any other enactment.
- 1.6 Revogation and Amendment

All permanent traffic regulation orders and speed limit orders, which relate to local Highway Authority roads wholly within Monmouthshire, made prior to this Order are hereby revoked. For the avoidance of any confusion, this does not include traffic regulation orders and speed limit orders on the following roads/sections of road:

(i) M4 branch to from Cardiff towards the second Severn Crossing:

(II) M48 branch to Chepstow and the Severn Crossing:

- (III) A40, linking the M60 via Monmouth and Abergavenny with Brecon and west Wales:
- (iv) A465, linking the Heads of the Valleys with Abergavenny and continuing towards Hereford:

- (v) A449, connecting Newport with the A40 towards Monmouth and the M50;
- (vi) A4042, connecting Newport with Abergavenny;
- (vii) A48/A466, from the M48 through Chepstow to the English border.
- 1.7 All parts of permanent traffic regulation orders and speed limit orders which relate to local Highway Authority roads, which are continuous between Monmouthshire and adjacent local authorities, made prior to this Order, are hereby amended, by the deletion of those parts that relate to roads in Monmouthshire.

#### 1.8 Errors

in the event that this Order contains errors, which invalidate parts of it directly, those errors will not invalidate unrelated parts of the Order.

1.9 Interpretation

In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

"Bus" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted to carry more than 8 passengers (exclusive of the driver);

"Carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a highway being a way over which the public have a right of way for the purpose of vehicular traffic;

"Charging Car Park" means a Parking Place listed in Schedule 2 of this Order that has a Parking Fee specified in Column 6 of that Schedule;

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council, under Section 76 of the Act of 2004, as amended, to supervise and enforce the restrictions imposed by this Order;

"Coach" means a motor vehicle constructed or adapted to carry more than 14 passengers (exclusive of the driver);

"Commercial Vehicle" means any vehicle whether mechanically propelled or not which is constructed or adapted for the carriage of goods and has a maximum gross metric weight exceeding 5 tonnes;

"Days of Operation" applies to Parking Places listed in Schedule 2 of this Order and means the days prescribed in Column 3 of that Schedule during which the Parking Place is available for motorists to use;

"Designated Officer" means an officer appointed by the Council to manage vahicular access and waiting on roads where driving and waiting is otherwise prohibited;

"Disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000, as amended, and being used in accordance with those regulations;

"Disabled person's vehicle" means a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a Disabled person's badge in accordance with the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000;

"Driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a Parking Place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"Goods" for the purpose of loading/unloading means goods or packages that are not easily portable;

"Goods Vehicle" means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adepted for the carriage or haulage of goods or burden of any description and IS NOT drawing a trailer

"Hours of Operation" applies to Parking Places listed in Schedule 2 of this Order and means the hours prescribed in Column 4 of that Schedule during which the Parking Place is available for motorists to use:

"Loading" means the loading of goods onto or the removing of goods from a vehicle, which by virtue of the weight, size, value or quantity of the goods requires the vehicle to be stationary at that location. Loading is only deemed to be taking place if there is continuous activity involved with loading. Loading includes checking of goods for the purposes of their collection or delivery and signing of receipts;

"Main Carriageway" means any carriageway used primarily by through traffic and includes any carriageway of a silp road but excludes any lay-by:

"Maximum Gross Weight" has the same meaning as defined in the TSRGD;

"Maximum Period" applies to Parking Places listed in Schedule 2 of this Order and means the maximum time that a vehicle may wait in the Parking Place as specified in Column 6 of that Schedule;

"Motorcycle" has the same meaning as defined in Section 185(1c) of the Road Traffic Act 1988;

"Motor vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads as set out in Section 136(1) of the 1984 Act:

"MPH" means miles per hour;

"National Speed Limit" means any prohibition imposed on a road by the 70 miles per hour, 60 miles per hour and 50 miles per hour (Temporary Speed Limit) Order 1977(d) or by regulation 3 of the Motorways Traffic (Speed Limits) Regulations 1974(e);

"Order Plans" means the plans listed in Schedule 4, including the key and incorporated in this Order. Most of the order plans show all of the prohibitions and restrictions that apply to the areas shown on them. Where there are different types of prohibitions or restrictions, at the same location, making it impracticable to show them all on one order plan, there is more than one order plan, each showing some of the prohibitions or restrictions:

"Overstay Penalty Payment" means a Discounted Penalty Charge Payment made at the pay machine if overstay is one hour or less.

"Owner" in relation to a vehicle which is registered to be licensed under the provisions of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1992 means the person in whose name the vehicle was registered under the said Act on the date on which the vehicle was left in the Parking Place in question;

"Parent and Toddler Parking Place" applies to Parking Places listed in Schedule 2 of this Order and means any parking place or bay identified by appropriate traffic signs and/or road markings as designated for the sole use of an adult with a child travelling in the vehicle using such a parking bay;

"Parking Bay" means a space within a parking place provided for the leaving of a vehicle and indicated by the appropriate road markings;

"Parking Disc" means a disc issued by a local authority or authorised provider and complying with the requirements for parking discs but coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"Parking Fee" applies to Parking Places listed in Schedule 2 of this Order and means the sum specified in Column 5 of that Schedule to be paid by the Driver, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, of any vehicle left in a Charging Car Park and for the avoidance of doubt where any vehicle tows arry other vehicle: into a Charging Car Park, the appropriate Parking Fee shall be paid in respect of each vehicle;

"Parking Permit" means a permit issued by the Council under the provision of this Order that may be used in specific on-street permit parking zones or car parks as specified on the permit;

"Parking Ticket" means any ticket issued from a Ticket Machine or issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer or any other person duly authorised by the Council:

"Pedal Cycle" means a unicycle, bicycle or cycle having four or more wheels, not being in any case mechanically propelled unless it is an electrically assisted pedal cycle that is not treated as a motor vehicle for the purposes of the 1984 Act(a);

"Pedestrian Zone" means an area which has been laid out to improve amenity for pedestrians and to which the entry of vehicles is prohibited or restricted:

"Penalty Charge" and "Reduced Penalty Charge" means a charge set by the Council, under the provisions of Section 77 of the Act of 2004 in accordance with the relevant statutory regulations or guidance given by the Secretary of State for Transport, which is to be paid in the manner prescribed in the penalty charge notice;

"Penalty Charge Notice" means a notice issued by a civil enforcement officer or the Council pursuant to the provisions of Section 78 of the Act of 2004;

"Permitted Position" means, where parking bays are provided, wholly within a bay marked in the Parking Place;

"Permit Holder" means a person who has been issued with a permit by the Council under the provision of this order;

"Police Vehicle" means a vehicle used for police purposes or operating under the instructions of a chief officer of police in pursuance of statutory duties;

"Public Service Vehicle" means a motor vehicle of a type defined in Section 1 of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981:

"Relevant Position" means:-

(I) In the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen, the permit, parking ticket, Walver Certificate, Disabled Person's Parking Badge or Parking Disc is exhibited thereon either on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from the outside of the vehicle, or on the dashboard or fascia panel so that the details on the front of the document are legible from outside the vehicle; or

(II) where the vehicle is not fitted with a front windscreen, dashboard or fascial panel the permit, parking ticket, Walver Certificate, Disabled Person's Parking Badge or Parking Disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle, so that the front of the permit, parking ticket or disabled badge is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;

"Resident" means a person whose usual residence is at premises the postal address of which is in any street or part of a street specified in Column 7 of Schedule 1 to this Order.

"Restricted Zone" means an area or road indicated by appropriate Traffic Signs as specified in the TSRGD, where parking is only permitted in designated Parking Places and the remainder of the kerbside space is subject to No Waiting and No Loading;

"Road Marking" meens a sign consisting of a line, mark or legend on a road or within a car park;

"Side of Road" means that part of a road from its centre to its highway boundary, including any verge and footway;

"Speed limit" has the same meaning as defined in the TSRGD:

"T" means tonnes maximum gross weight, as shown on the Order Plans;

"Taxi" means a vehicle licensed under:

- (i) Section 37 of the Town Police Clauses Act 1847(a);or
- (II) Section 6 of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act 1869(b)

"Ticket Machine" means an apparatus of a type and design approved by the Secretary of State, for the purposes of this Order being an apparatus designed to issue, upon the insertion of an appropriate coin, coins or card into the apparatus provided, a numbered ticket or tickets indicating the payment of the parking charge referred to in Article 6(1) of this Order and to indicate the time by which the parking period for which payment was made by the parking charge will expire;

"Traffic Sign" means a sign of any size, colour or type prescribed or authorised under, or having effect as though prescribed or authorised under the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (as amended):

"Trailer" means a vehicle drawn by a motor vehicle:

"TSRGD" means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016, as amended.

"Universal Service Provider" has the same meaning as that assigned to it in section 4(3) of the Postal Services Act 2000.

"Unladen Vehicle" has the same meaning as defined in the TSRGD,

"Walver (Dispensation) Certificate" means a certificate issued by or on behalf of the Council for the purposes of this Order permitting a specified vehicle to wait in specified circumstances on a length or lengths of roads where the waiting of that vehicle would otherwise be restricted or prohibited;

"Zone" means the permit zone number or reference which identifies at which parking places a valid permit may be used.

- 1.10 For the purposes of this Order where a vehicle is drawing a trailer or caravan the vehicle and the trailer or caravan shall be deemed to be separate vehicles and the driver of the leading vehicle shall be deemed to be the driver of both vehicles.
- 1.11 Any reference to any numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to an Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- 1.12 Any Reference in this Order to the male gender shall read as applying equally to the female gender.

- 1.13 The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any regulation or Order made or having effect as if rnade under the Act of 1984.
- 1.14 In so far as any provision of this Order conflicts with any provision which is contained in an Order made or having effect as if made under the Act, or by or under any other enactment THEN the provisions of THIS ORDER SHALL PREVAIL.
- 1.15 In accordance with the provisions of Section 46A of the Act of 1984, the Council may vary or amend any charges imposed by this Order by publishing the proposed charges in the prescribed manner.
- 1.16 Headings are only for convenience and do not affect the construction of this Order.

#### 2. SPEED LIMITS

2.1 Save as provided in articles 2.2 and 2.3, no person shall drive any vehicle, along a road identified on the order plans, at a speed exceeding the speed limit identified for that length of road on the Order Plans.

- 2.2 No speed limit imposed by this Order shall apply to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire and rescue authority, ambulance or police purposes in pursuance of their statutory duty, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.
- 2.3 No speed limit imposed by this Order shall apply to any vehicle falling within Regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those Regulations.

#### 3. PRESCRIBED ROUTES

Save as provided in articles 3.3 and 3.4, no person shall, except upon the direction of a police officer or police community support officer in uniform, cause any vehicle to proceed, in a length of road identified as one-way on the Order plans, other than in the direction pointed by the arrows forming part of .

the identification.

- 3.2 No left, right or U-turns
  Save as provided in articles 3.3 to 3.4, except upon the direction of a police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, no person shall cause any vehicle to make a left turn, right turn or u-turn at a location identified on the Order plans, as no left turn, no right turn or prohibition of u-turns, in the direction pointed by the arrows, forming part of the identification or described in words on the order plans.
- 3.3 Nothing in articles 3.1 and 3.2 shall apply to any vehicle on an occasion when it is being used for fire and rescue authority, ambulance or police purposes in pursuance of their statutory duty, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.
- 3.4 Nothing in articles 3.1 to 3.2 shall apply to any class of vehicle, on a road or part of a road, where it is shown on the Order plans that that class of vehicle is exempted.

## 4. PROHIBITION OF DRIVING

4.1 Prohibition of Entry

Except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in a road in the direction identified on the Order Plans as prohibition of entry.

4.2 Prohibition of Driving or Traffic

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in a length of road identified on the Order Plans only as prohibition of driving or traffic.

4.3 Prohibition of motor vehicles except for access

Save as provided in articles 4.10 to 4.13, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle or class of motor vehicle identified on the Order Plans, to proceed in a length of road identified on the order plans as prohibition of driving except for access, at any time or during the days and times identified on those plans.

4.4 Prohibition of motor vehicles except for loading

Save as provided in articles 4.10 to 4.13, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle or class of motor vehicle identified on the Order Plans, to proceed in a length of road identified on the order plans as prohibition of driving except for loading, at any time or during the days and times identified on those plans.

4.5 Pedestrian Zone A.

Save as provided in articles 4.11, 4.13 and 4.14, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in any length of road identified on the Order Plans as Pedestrian Zone A.

4.6 Pedestrian Zone B

Save as provided in articles 4.11, 4.13 and 4.15, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle or to proceed in any length of road identified on the Order Plans as Pedestrian Zone B.

4.7 Pedestrian Zone C

Save as provided in articles 4.11, 4.13 and 4.16, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in any length of road identified on the Order Plans as Pedestrian Zone C.

4.8 Weight Restriction

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle the weight of which, whether laden or unladen, exceeds the weight limit identified on the Order Plans, to proceed in the length of road identified on those plans.

4

4.9 Height Restriction

No person shall cause or permit any vehicle the height of which, whether laden or unladen, exceeds the height limit identified on the Order Plans, to proceed in the length of road identified on those plans.

- 4.10 Nothing in articles 4.1, 4.2 and 4.3 shall apply to any class of vehicle, on a road or part of a road, where it is shown on the Order Plans that the class of vehicle is exempt.
- 4.11 Nothing in articles 4.1, 4.2, 4.3 and 4.4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in any length of road referred to in those articles, if the vehicle is being used for fire and rescue authority, ambulance or police purposes in pursuance of its statutory duty, if the observance of that provision would be likely to hinder the use of the vehicle for the purpose for which it is being used on that occasion.
- 4.12 Nothing in articles 4.3 and 4.4 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in a length of road referred to in that article if the vehicle is being used for the conveyance of persons or goods to or from premises situated on or adjacent to the length of road or requires access to private property situated along the length of road.
- 4.13 Nothing in articles 4.3 and 4.4, shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in any length of road referred to in those articles, if the vehicle is being used:-
  - (a) in connection with the carrying out of any building works on, or in premises situated on or edjacent to that length of road;

(b) the removal of obstructions to traffic;

(c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road;

(d) the laying erection alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to that length of road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water gas or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus:

(e) in the service of a local authority or a water or sewerage undertaker in

pursuance of statutory powers or duties:

(f) In connection with mechanical road cleansing or mechanical refuse collection; or

- (g) for the purpose of delivering postal packets by a Universal Service Provider.
- 4.14 Nothing in article 4.5 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in a length of road referred to in those articles if the vehicle is being used for loading to or from premises situated on or adjacent to the length of road.

4.15 Nothing in article 4.6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in a length of road referred to in that article between the hours 7:00am – 10:30am and 4:30pm – 7:00pm if the vehicle is being used for loading to or from premises situated on or adjacent to the length of road.

4.16 Nothing in article 4.7 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to proceed in a length of road referred to in that article if the driver has a valid permit to park in designated Permit Parking Places on the said length of road.

#### 5. STOPPING AND WAITING.

5.1 Main carriageway clearway

Save as provided in articles 5.7 and 5.8, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait on the roads identified on the Order Plans as Main Carriageway Clearways.

5.2 School Keep Clears
Not used.

5.3 No Walting and No Loading

Save as provided in articles 5.7 to 5.12, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the roads or sides of the roads identified on the Order Plans as No Waiting at Any Time and No Loading either at any time or during certain days and times as shown on those plans.

5.4 No Walting

Save as provided in articles 5.7 to 5.12, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the roads or sides of the roads identified on the Order Plans as No Waiting either at any time or during certain days and times as shown on those plans.

5.5 No Walting by a Commercial Vehicle

Save as provided in articles 5.7 to 5.12, no person shall except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any Commercial Vehicle to wait in the length of roads or sides of the roads identified on the Order Plans as No Waiting by Commercial Vehicles during the times shown on those plans.

5,6 Restricted Zone

Save as provided in articles 5.7, 5.8, 5.11 and 5.12, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle including Disabled Person's Parking Badge holder vehicles to wait in a length of road identified on the Order Plans as a Restricted Zone, unless they are waiting in a designated Parking Place and the vehicle is the correct vehicle type or class specified on Traffic Signs for that Parking Place.

- 5.7 Nothing in articles 5.1 to 5.6, shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to wait in any length of road referred to in those articles, if the vehicle is being used:-
  - (a) in connection with the carrying out of any building works on, or in premises situated on or adjacent to that length of road:

(b) the removal of obstructions to traffic:

(c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road;

(d) the laying erection alteration or repair in or in land adjacent to that length of road of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water gas or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus;

(e) in the service of the Council or a water or sewerage undertaker in pursuance of statutory powers or duties:

(f) in connection with mechanical road cleansing or mechanical refuse collection:

(g) to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to the road or sides of road where the restriction is in operation; or

(h) for the purpose of delivering and collecting postal packets by a Universal Service Provider.

- 5.8 Nothing in articles 5.1 to 5.6 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to wait in any length of road referred to in those articles, if the vehicle is being used for fire and rescue authority, ambulance or police purposes in pursuance of its statutory duty.
- 6.9 Nothing in articles 5.1 to 5.6 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any motor vehicle to wait in any length of road referred to in those articles, if the vehicle is displaying a valid Waiver (Dispensation) Certificate in a relevant position that has been issued by the Council in accordance with Article 8.1 of this Order.
- 5.10 Except during the periods for no loading specified in article 5.3, nothing in articles 5.3, 5.4 and 5.6 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any length of road referred to in those articles, if the vehicle is displaying a valid Disabled Person's Parking Badge and associated Parking Disc, set at the time of arrival, which has been displayed in a relevant position. The maximum length of stay will be 3 hours with no return within 1 hour of leaving.
- 5.11 Except during the periods specified for no loading in article 5.3, nothing in article 5.3 to 5.6 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle other than that prescribed in this Order to wait in the lengths or sides of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from a vehicle.
- 5.12 Nothing in articles 5.3 to 5.6, shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the lengths or sides of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle.

## 5.13 Contravention and Enforcement

ď

- 5.13.1 Where a contravention of this Order constitutes a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, the contravention shall be subject to the penalties and procedures provided for by that legislation.
- 5.13.2 Where a contravention of this Order constitutes a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, a penalty charge is payable for each calendar day or part thereof that the vehicle is in contravention of this Order by the owner and the vehicle may be removed by or on behalf of the Council in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 2004 and of this Order.
- 5.13.3 A contravention of this Order which does not constitute a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, is an offence under Section 35A(1) of the 1984 Act.

# 6. ON-STREET PERMITTED PARKING PLACES

#### 6.1. Limited Walting

Save as provided in articles 6.10 and 6.11, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait for longer than the maximum period for waiting, or return within the period stated, on the roads or sides of roads identified on the Order Plans as limited waiting, for the periods shown on those plans.

- 6.1.1 The limits of the Limited Waiting Parking Place shall be indicated by the appropriate signs and markings as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016, as amended.
- 6.1.2 Every vehicle left in a Limited Waiting Parking Place designated by this Order shall stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay.

#### 6.2 Disabled Persons Only Parking Place

Save as provided in articles 6.10 and 6.11, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle, other than any vehicle which is being used for the conveyance of a disabled person and has displayed in a conspicuous position a disabled person's badge in accordance with the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulations 2000 as amended, to wait on the roads or sides of the roads identified on the Order Plans as disabled persons parking persons parking places, at any time or for the periods shown on those plans.

- 6.2.1 In addition to article 6.2, where on the Order Plans Disabled Persons Parking Places are identified for limited waiting by disabled badge holders, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police constable or police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait for longer than the maximum period for waiting or return within the period stated. The vehicle must display a valid Disabled Person's Parking Badge and Parking Disc in a relevant position and the Parking Disc must be set to show the time of arrival.
- 6.2.2 The limits of the Disabled Person's Only Parking Place shall be indicated by the appropriate signs and markings as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016, as amended.
- 6.2.3 Every vehicle left in a Disabled Person's Only Parking Place designated by this Order shall stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay.

#### 6.3 Loading Only Bay

Save as provided in articles 6.10 and 6.11, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any

vehicle, except to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle, to wait on the roads or sides of the roads identified on the Order Plans as loading only, at any time or for the periods shown on those plans.

- 6.3.1 The limits of the Loading Bay shall be indicated by the appropriate signs and markings as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016, as amended.
- 6.3.2 Every vehicle left in a Loading Bay designated by this Order shall stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the Loading Bay.
- 6.4 Taxi Only Parking Place
  Save as provided in articles 6.10 and 6.11, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle except a text, to walt on the roads or sides of the roads identified on the Order Plans as Taxis Only, at any time or for the periods shown on those plans.
- 6.4.1 The limits of the Taxi Parking Place shall be indicated by the appropriate signs and markings as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016, as amended.
- 6.4.2 Every vehicle left in a Taxi Only Parking Place designated by this Order shall stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay:
- Save as provided in articles 6.10 and 6.11, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle other than a police vehicle to wait on the roads or sides of roads identified on the Order Plans as Police Vehicles Only.
- 6.5.1 The limits of the Police Vehicle Only Parking Place shall be indicated by the appropriate signs and markings as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016, as amended.
- 6.5.2 Every vehicle left in a Police Vehicle Only Parking Place designated by this Order shall stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay.
- Goach Only Parking Piace
  Save as provided in articles 6.10 and 6.11, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle other than a Coach to wait on the roads or sides of roads identified on the Order Pians as Coach Parking Only.

- 6.6.1 The limits of the Coach Parking Place shall be indicated by the appropriate signs and markings as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016, as amended.
- 6.6.2 Every vehicle left in a Coach Parking Place designated by this Order shall stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay.
- 6.7 Doctor Vehicle Only Parking Place
  Save as provided in articles 6.10 and 6.11, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle other than a Doctor's vehicle to wait on the roads or sides of roads identified on the Order Plans as Doctors Vehicles only.
- 6.7.1 The limits of the Doctors Vehicle Only Parking Place shall be indicated by the appropriate signs and markings as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016, as amended.
- 6.7.2 Every vehicle left in a Doctors Vehicle Only Parking Place designated by this Order shall stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay.
- 6.8 Permit Holders Parking Place
  Save as provided in articles 6.9 to 6.11 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Parking Enforcement Officer, police officer or a police community support officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle other than a valid Permit Holder to walt on the roads or sides of roads identified on the order plans as Permit Holder Vehicles only.
- 6.8.1 The limits of the Permit Holder Parking Place shall be indicated by the appropriate signs and markings as specified in the Traffic Signs Regulations & General Directions 2016, as amended.
- 6.8.2 Where the limits of the Permit Holders Only Parking Place are indicated by marked bays, every vehicle left in a Permit Holder Parking Place designated by this Order shall stand so that every part of the vehicle is wholly within the limits of the parking bay.
- 6.9 Nothing in articles 6.1 to 6.8 shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait in the lengths or sides of roads referred to therein for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following-
  - (a) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;

(b) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

(c) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of a road;

(d) constructing, improving, maintaining or cleaning any street furniture including bus stop infrastructure; or

(e) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity; or of any telecommunications apparatus kept installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position or

(f) the opening or closing of a door or gate to allow the vehicle to exit or

enter the road

. .

# 6.10 Nothing in articles 6.1 to 6.8 applies to-

(a) a vehicle being used for fire and rescue authority, ambulance or police purposes or by the Council in pursuance of its statutory duties;

(b) a vehicle being used by a doctor, nurse or midwife attending an

emergency;

(c) a vehicle which is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond the driver's control or which has to be stopped in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property;

(d) a vehicle displaying a valid Walver (Dispensation) Certificate in a relevant position that has been issued by the Council in accordance

with Article 8.1 of this Order.

## 8.11 Nothing in article 6.8 applies to-

(a) a vehicle of a universal service provider being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets;

(b) a vehicle taking part in a funeral, provided the vehicle is in the service

of a business of funeral directors and is attended throughout:

(c) a vehicle taking part in a wedding, provided the vehicle is the principal vehicle for the carriage of the wedding party and is attended throughout; or

(d) a vehicle displaying a valid Disabled Person's Parking Badge and associated Parking Disc, set at the time of arrival, which has been displayed in a relevant position. The maximum length of stay will be 3

hours with no return within 1 hour of leaving.

#### 6.12 Contravention and Enforcement

- 6.12.1 Where a contravention of this Order constitutes a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, the contravention shall be subject to the penalties and procedures provided for by that legislation.
- 6.12.2 Where a contravention of this Order constitutes a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, a penalty charge is payable for each calendar day or part thereof that the vehicle is in contravention of this Order by the owner and the vehicle may be removed by

or on behalf of the Council in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 2004 and of this Order.

6.12.3 A contravention of this Order which does not constitute a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, is an offence under Section 35A(1) of the 1984 Act.

#### 7. OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES

7.1 Conditions of use of Parking Places

4

- 7.1.1 Except with the written authority of the Council, no Parking Place may be used other than as a parking place for such classes of vehicle as are specified in relation to that Parking Place in Column 2 of Schedule 2 on the Days of Operation and during the Hours of Operation and in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- 7.1.2 Except with the written authority of the Council the Driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in a Parking Place for longer than the maximum period permitted for waiting specified in Column 4 of Schedule 2 in relation to that Parking Place.
- 7.1.3 No person shall use a Parking Place or any part thereof which has been closed in part or in whole by authority of the Council.
- 7.1.4 The Driver of a vehicle using a Parking Place shall not permit the vehicle to be left in that Parking Place otherwise than in the Permitted Position.
- 7.1.5 Where, in a Parking Place, signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of indicating:-
  - (a) The entrance or exit from the Parking Place, or that a vehicle using the parking place shall process in a specified direction within it, then no person shall drive any vehicle so that it enters the Parking Place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit so indicated, or in a direction other than that specified, as the case may be; or
  - (b) That certain parking bays are for the use of vehicles displaying a Disabled Person's Parking Badge then no person shall park a vehicle within those parking bays or areas UNLESS it is a vehicle displaying in the relevant position a valid Disabled Person's Parking Badge;
  - (c) That certain parking bays or areas of a Parking Place are for the use of solo motorcycles then no person shall park a vehicle within those parking bays or areas UNLESS it is a motor cycle as defined in this Order;
  - (d) That certain parking bays or areas of a Parking Place are for the use of buses or coaches then no person shall park a vehicle within those parking bays or areas UNLESS it is a bus or coach as defined in this Order;
  - (e) That certain parking bays or areas of a Parking Place are for the use of pedal cycles then no person shall park a vehicle within those parking bays or areas UNLESS it is a pedal cycle as defined in this Order;

- (f) That certain parking bays or areas of a Parking Place are for the use of parents and toddlers a certain class or type of vehicle as indicated by an appropriate sign or road marking then no person shall park a vehicle within those parking bays or areas UNLESS it is a vehicle carrying a child.
- 7.1.6 Where an area is designated as 'loading only' the driver of a vehicle shall not permit the vehicle to wait in the loading area unless it is actively loading or unloading. Loading and unloading must be a continuous activity and the vehicle must be moved once it is complete.
- 7.1.7 If the loading bay specified in paragraph 7.1.6 is designated for 'goods vehicles only' by virtue of appropriate signage, then no person shall park a vehicle within the loading bay UNLESS it is a vehicle of the specified type.
- 7.1.8 If a 2.5 tonnes unladen weight limit is in operation on or in a Parking Place and signs are erected for the purpose of indicating this restriction, then no person shall enter or park a vehicle within the Parking Place UNLESS it is a vehicle with a weight below the limit specified.
- 7.1.9 No person shall without the written authority of the Council while a vehicle is in a Parking Place use the Parking Place for any purpose other than parking the vehicle, boarding or alighting from the vehicle or taking out of or into the vehicle, and in particular but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions of this article shall not:-
  - (a) Carry out any work of construction, overhauling, alteration, cleaning or repair in respect of the vehicle except such as necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved from the Parking Place:
  - (b) Use the vehicle in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the Parking Place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his or someone else's skill or services;
  - (c) Use the vehicle for the purposes of storing any goods or materials with a view to selling or delivering such articles to persons in or near to the Parking Place.
- 7.1.10 No person shall use any part of a Parking Place or any vehicle left in a Parking Place:-
  - (a) For sleeping or camping purposes; or
  - (b) For eating or cooking purposes.
- 7.1.11 No person shall in any Parking Place:-

- (a) Erect or cause or permit to be erected any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure without the written consent of the Council; or
- (b) Light or cause or permit to be lit any fire.

7.1.12 The Driver of a vehicle other than a caravan, trailer or pedal cycle shall not permit that vehicle to be left in a Parking Place unless the vehicle is licensed in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act. 1994 and unless there is in relation to the use of the vehicle by the Driver such policy of insurance as compiles with the requirements of Part VI of the Road Traffic Act of 1988.

## 7.1.13 No person shall except:

į.

- (a) with the permission of an Authorised Officer, or
- (b) where they have a legal right of access through the Parking Place,

drive any vehicle or ride any pedal cycle or other machine in a Parking Place other than for the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the Parking Place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the Parking Place.

- 7.1.14 No person shall in a Parking Place destroy, damage, interfere with or deface any property belonging to the Council and in addition to the penalty provided by Schedule 2, Part 1, to the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988 any person so doing so shall be liable for and shall pay to the Council the full cost of repairs of the damage.
- 7.1.15 No person shall in a Parking Place wantonly shout or otherwise make any loud noise or sound any horn or other similar instrument or do anything to the disturbance or annoyance of users of the Parking Place or residents or occupiers of premises in the neighbourhood.
- 7.1.16 No person shall in a Parking Place use any threatening, abusive or insulting words or behaviour with intent to put any person in fear or to produce a brake of the peace.
- 7.1.17 No person shall in a Parking Place distributed or cause to be distributed or sell or cause to be sold any leaflets, pamphiets, papers, journals or any other similar materials or publications without the written consent of the Council.
- 7.1.18 No person shall within any Parking Place do anything which if the Parking Place were land in the open air would constitute an offence under the provisions of the Refuse Disposal (Amenity) Act 1978.
- 7.1.19 No person shall in a Parking Place cause or permit to be driven any vehicle in a reckless or dangerous manner or at a speed exceeding 10mph.

#### 7.2. Parking Charges and Method of Payment-

- 7:2.1 Save as provided in article 7.2.8 of this Order, no person shall leave or cause any vehicle to be left in those Parking Places, specified in Schedule 2 to this Order, at which a parking charge is applicable, as specified in Column 5 and for the maximum period specified in Column 6 of the said Schedule, during the charging period except upon payment of the appropriate parking charge or if displaying a valid parking permit exempting the driver from the charge.
- 7.2.2 The parking charge shall be payable on the leaving of a vehicle in a Parking Place, at which a parking charge is applicable, by the insertion into the ticket machine, relating to that Parking Place or parking bay in which the vehicle is left, a coin, coins, bank notes, payment cards or tokens (where appropriate) of such denomination, as may be indicated on the ticket machine, making up the amount of the parking charge for the parking period required.
- 7.2.3 Where in any Parking Piace, at which a parking charge is applicable, a ticket machine becomes inoperable for any reason and no alternative ticket machine is available within the Parking Piace, then the driver of any vehicle using any such Parking Piace shall when so requested by a Civil Enforcement Officer or any other person duly authorised by the Council pay that Officer the appropriate Parking Fee in respect thereof and shall obtain from the Officer a Ticket indicating that appropriate Parking Fee has been paid.
- 7.2.4 Where a parking charge has been paid in accordance with the provisions of articles 7.2.2 and 7.2.3, the driver thereof shall exhibit in the vehicle in a relevant position a ticket or tickets issued, relating to the Parking Place in which the vehicle is left.
- 7.2.5 The ticket or tickets referred to in articles 7.2.2 and 7.3.3 shall be exhibited in a relevant position on the front of the vehicle so that the day and time of issue, or day and time of expiry and the parking place(s) for which it was issued, which are shown on the front of the said ticket(s), are clearly visible to the Civil Enforcement Officer from outside the vehicle.
- 7,2.6 Any Parking Ticket issued shall be transferrable on the day of Issue between Charging Car Parks situated in the same town where the Parking Fees payable in respect of those Charging Car Parks are the same.
- 7.2.7 Where a ticket has been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with article 7.2.5, no person, not being the driver of the vehicle, shall remove the ticket from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.
- 7.2.8 The Council may issue to any eligible person a Parking Permit valid for use in specified Parking Places in accordance with the provisions of this Order and

this Parking Permit will provide the motorist with an exemption to the Parking Fee in operation.

# 7.2.8 The following will be exempt from payment of the Parking Charge:

- (a) Any vehicle which displays in the relevant position a valid Disabled Persons Badge:
- (b) A motorcycle;

- (c) A Pedal Cycle
- (d) A vehicle displaying a valid parking permit for the Parking Place in which it is left:
- (e) A vehicle displaying a valid Walver (Dispensation) Certificate in a relevant position that has been issued by the Council in accordance with Article 8.1 of this Order.
- (f) Any vehicle instructed to park under the direction of a Police Officer in uniform:
- (g) Any vehicle being used by the Fire and Rescue Authority, the Police, the Ambulance Service or the Council in pursuance of its statutory duties:
- (h) The vehicle is waiting only for so long as is reasonably necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle:
- (I) The vehicle is waiting only for so long as reasonably necessary to enable goods to be loaded onto or from the vehicle from or to premises adjacent to the Parking Place;
- (j) The vehicle is at the time in the service of a universal service provider and is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the Parking Place, in which the vehicle is waiting, are being unloaded from the vehicle, or having been unloaded there from, are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the Parking Place, in which the vehicle is waiting.

# 7.3 Indication as evidence of not paying a Parking Charge

- 7.3.1 Save as provided in article 7.2.8 of this Order, if at any time while a vehicle is left in a Parking Place during the charging period, no valid ticket is exhibited on the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order it shall be presumed, unless the contrary is proved, that a parking charge has not been duly paid and a contravention has occurred.
- 7.3.2 If at any time while a vehicle is left in a Parking Place during the charging period the ticket, issued by a ticket machine or a Civil Enforcement Officer, exhibited on the vehicle indicates that the parking period for which payment was made by the parking charge has already expired, then those indications shall be evidence that a contravention has occurred.

## 7.4 Removal and disposal of vehicles

- 7.4.1 if a vehicle is left in a Parking Place in a position other than a Permitted Position, then a Civil Enforcement Officer may move the vehicle or cause it to be moved to a Permitted Position or may remove the vehicle or cause it to be removed from the Parking Place.
- 7.4.2 If a vehicle is deemed to be abandoned or in the case of an emergency or Special Event, where the vehicle is deemed to be causing an obstruction or a risk to safety, then the Police, a Civil Enforcement Officer or any other person duly authorised by the Council may move or cause to be moved any vehicle left in a Parking Place to any place he thinks fit.
- 7.4.3 Any person moving or removing a vehicle in accordance with articles 7.4.1 and 7.4.2 may do so by towing or driving or in such a manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to the vehicle as he may think necessary to enable him to move or remove it as aforesaid.
- 7.4.4 When a Civil Enforcement Officer or any other person duty authorised by the Council moves or removes a vehicle or causes it to be moved or removed from a Parking Place in accordance with articles 7.4.1 and 7.4.2, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle but neither the Council, its servants or agents shall be liable for any loss or damage to any such vehicle or its contents arising from or in consequence of the exercise of the powers contained in articles 7.4.1 and 7.4.2.
- 7.4.5 Section 102 of the 1984 Act shall apply to this Order in respect of the recovery. by the Council of charges for the moving or removal of vehicles in accordance with articles 7.4.1 and 7.4.2 for storage and custody of such vehicles and for disposal of abandoned vehicles.
- 7.4.6 Where a vehicle has been removed from a Parking Place in accordance with Articles 7.4.1 and 7.4.2 and it appears to the Council to have been abandoned, the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle after having made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of the vehicle PROVIDED THAT the Council shall be deemed to have made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of any vehicle which this Article applies if it has taken in relation to that vehicle such steps as may be prescribed by any regulations for the time being in force by virtue of the Act of 1984, the Refuse Disposal (Amenity) Act 1978 or any other Act authorising the Council to sell or otherwise dispose of abandoned vehicles.

7.5 No liability for loss or damage to vehicle or property
Vehicles using the Parking Places do so at the risk of the driver and the
Council accepts no liability or responsibility either at common law or under the
Occupiers' Liability Act 1957 or otherwise for loss of or damage to vehicles or
other property left in parking places

#### 7.6 Contravention and Enforcement

- 7.6.1 Where a contravention of this Order constitutes a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, the contravention shall be subject to the penalties and procedures provided for by that legislation.
- 7.6.2 Where a contravention of this Order constitutes a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, a penalty charge is payable for each calendar day or part thereof that the vehicle is in contravention of this Order by the owner and the vehicle may be removed by or on behalf of the Council in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 2004 and of this Order.
- -7.6.3 A contravention of this Order which does not constitute a parking contravention within the meaning of the Act of 2004, or successor legislation, is an offence under Section 35A(1) of the 1984 Act.

### 8. PARKING PERMITS

8.1 Eligibility to apply for permits

A person who resides in one of the streets identified in Column 7 of Schedule 1 of this Order may apply to the Council for the issue of a Resident Parking Place or Resident Car Park Permit for the relevant Parking Place.

- 8.1.1 In the event that the conditions set out in article 8.1.2 are satisfied the Council may provide a single Resident Permit per dwelling.
- 8.1.2 Save as provided in article 8.1, the conditions referred to in article 8.1.1 is that the Council is satisfied that the person making the Resident Permit application is:
  - (i) A resident of the eligible property specified on the application and uses that eligible property as their principle place of residence; and
  - (ii) The vehicle named on the application is registered to the eligible property.
- 8.1.3 In the event that the conditions set out in article 8.1.4 are satisfied the Council may provide a single Resident Car Park Permit per dwelling.
- 8.1.4 Save as provided in article 8.1, the conditions referred to in article 8.1.3 is that the Council is satisfied that the person making the Resident Car Park Permit application is:
  - (i) A resident of the eligible property specified in the application and uses that eligible property as their principle place of residence; and
  - (ii) The vehicle named on the application is registered to the eligible property.
- 8.1.5 Any person may apply for a Long Stay and Short Stay Car Park Season Permit.
- 8.2 Application Procedure and Evidence

Any application for a parking permit shall be made on the relevant permit application form prescribed by the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form to be supplied and shall be accompanied by the permit fee, where applicable.

8.2.1 On receipt of an application, made under the foregoing provisions of this article, the Council, being satisfied that the application meets the criteria specified in the provisions of this Order and the terms and conditions may lesue the appropriate parking permit for the leaving, in the appropriate Parking Place, of the vehicle for which such application was made.

- 8.2.3 The issue of a parking permit does not guarantee a parking space and a permit will be deemed invalid if the vehicle is not parked in a designated Parking Place or bay in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
- 8.2.4 The Council may at any time require an applicant for a permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of an application made to them as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars or information given to them or in respect of any permit issued by them as they may reasonably require to verify that the applicant is entitled to apply or that the permit has been validly issued or being validly used.

#### 8.3 Form of Permits

A Parking Permit shall include the following particulars:-

- (a) The name of the Parking Place(s) in which the permit may be used;
- (b) The registration of the vehicle that is eligible to park in the parking bay or place;
- (c) The type of permit;
- (d) The date when the permit expires; and
- (e) An authentication that the permit has been issued by the Council.

#### 8.4 Permit Fee

The Council may levy a charge in connection with the issue of a parking permit for the leaving of a vehicle in a Parking Place designated under the relevant provisions of this Order, and where such charge is levied it shall be:-

- (a) Resident on-street Permit £60 per permit per annum;
- (b) Resident Car Park Permit £60 per permit per annum;
- (c) Car Park Season Permit:
  - Long Stay 12 months £430
  - Long Stay 6 months £220
  - Long Stay 3 months £110
  - Short Stay 12 months £540
  - Short Stay 6 months £275
  - Short Stay 3 months £138
  - . And as outlined in Column 5 of Schedule 2
- 8.4.1 The Council may also levy a charge of £10 for the issue of a replacement parking permit if the original has been lost, stolen or damaged or if the Driver changes their vehicle during the validity period of the vehicle.

# 9. WAIVER (DISPENSATION) CERTIFICATE AND SUSPENSION OF PARKING PLACES

- 9.1 Walver (Dispensation) Certificate
  Nothing in articles 5.1 to 5.6, 6,1 to 6.8 and 7.2.1 of this Order shall prevent
  any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait on the restriction or in
  the designated Parking Place designated under the relevant provisions of this
  Order if it is displaying a valid Walver (Dispensation) Certificate lesued by the
  Council and the vehicle is waiting in accordance with the terms and conditions
  of the Walver (Dispensation) Certificate.
- 9.1.1 The Council may levy a charge in connection with the issue of a Walver (Dispensation) Certificate, and where such charge is levied it shall be £10.00 per vehicle per day, where a vehicle length is deemed to be 5.5 metres long.
- 9.1.2 A Waiver (Dispensation) Certificate may be cancelled at any time at the sole discretion of the Council and shall thereupon immediately cease to be valid. Notification of such cancellation shall be sent by post or e-mall to the holder of the Waiver (Dispensation) Certificate at any address that the Council believes to be that person's address and the Waiver Certificate shall forthwith be surrendered to the Council.
- 9.2 Suspension of a Parking Place

  The Council or a Civil Enforcement Officer may suspend the use of a Parking Place or any part there of whenever such supervision is considered reasonably necessary:-
  - (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
  - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to the parking place or the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the parking places or the laying, erection, alteration removal or maintenance in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer, main, pipe or apparatus for the safety of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus or traffic sign:
  - (c) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any parking place will be thronged or obstructed:
  - (d) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions; or
  - (a) for any other purpose subject to the prior written agreement of the Council.
- 9.2.1 The Council may levy a charge in connection with the administration and suspension of a Parking Place designated under the relevant provisions of this Order, and where such charge is levied it shall be £10.00 per vehicle per day, where a vehicle length is deemed to be 5.5 metres long for on-street suspensions and £10.00 per bay in an off-street facility.

- 9.2.2 Any person suspending the use of a Parking Place or any part thereof in 1 accordance with the provisions of this Order shall place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to the Parking Place or any part thereof, which is being suspended, a traffic sign or signs indicating that the parking place or part thereof is suspended.
- 9.2.3 No person shall cause or permit a vehicle to be left in a Parking Place or part thereof during the period that the suspension is in operation, other than:-
  - (a) An operational vehicle being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes as part of their statutory duties;
  - (b) Any vehicle left with the permission of the Council.
- The Council may permit free parking in any of the towns within Monmouthshire on up to three Saturdays in the run up to Christmas in any one year.
