In Pregnancy:



Healthy Start

If you're more than 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under 4, you may be entitled to get help to buy healthy food and milk.

If you're eligible, you'll be sent a Healthy Start card with money on it that you can use in some UK shops.

The NHS will add your benefit onto this card every 4 weeks.

You can use your card to buy:

- plain liquid cow's milk
- fresh, frozen, and tinned fruit and vegetables
- fresh, dried, and tinned pulses
- infant formula milk based on cow's milk

You can also use your card to collect:

- Healthy Start vitamins – these support you during pregnancy and breastfeeding
- vitamin drops for babies and young children – these are suitable from birth to 4 years old

Child Benefit

You can claim Child Benefit 48 hours after you've registered the birth of your child, or once a child comes to live with you.

It's usually paid to you every 4 weeks.

Anyone is eligible. If you earn over £50,000 a year, your payments are adjusted accordingly.

Tax-Free Childcare

If you're a working parent, you can get up to £500 every three months (up to £2,000 a year per child) to help with the costs of childcare, whatever your child's age.

You can use it to pay for childcare including: Childminders, day nurseries, playgroups and out of school care.

The childcare providers must be signed up to the service

Universal Credit Childcare Support

If you pay for childcare while you go to work, Universal Credit can pay some of your childcare costs.

Who is eligible for Universal Credit childcare costs?

You need to be either in paid work or starting a job in the next month. If you live with a partner, you both need to be in paid work, unless your partner cannot look after your children.

It does not matter how many hours you work – there is no minimum. It must be paid work, so you're not eligible if you are volunteering and only getting money for expenses.

Flying Start Provision and 2 Year Old Funding

Flying Start gives you access to a wide range of services including enhanced Health Visiting support, early language support; Part-time, free childcare for children aged 2 to 3 years of age at a provider registered for Flying Start provision.

The Welsh Government's Programme is committed to delivering a phased expansion of early years provision to include all two-year-olds, with a particular emphasis on strengthening Welsh-medium provision.

The two year old Flying Start childcare offer is focusing on a phased roll out of the part time, high quality childcare element of Flying Start to 2-3 year olds. Areas for the roll out have been identified using the Wales Index of Multiple Deprivation (WIMD), data from the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) and HM Revenue and Customs and are broken down by Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs).

The expansion has been completed for 2023 but as the programme expands across Monmouthshire in 2024, families will be contacted to let them know when their postcode is included as a target area.

The two year old childcare offer will entitle all 2 year olds to 12.5 hours of fully funded childcare, from the term after a child's 2nd birthday, for 39 weeks of the year.

The Childcare Offer

You may be eligible for the Childcare Offer from the term following your child's 3rd birthday, until the September in which they start reception.

This is a combination of early education and childcare funding, up to 30 hours a week, for 48 weeks of the year.

You can pay for any extra hours of childcare via a private contract with your childcare provider.

You can apply for the Childcare Offer funding up to 90 days before the start of the term that funding begins.

Early Education

There are a number of private childcare settings that provide early education.

Parents may choose either a school nursery or non-maintained approved setting in Monmouthshire.

Funding is available from the beginning of the term following the child's third birthday (term dates are defined as 1st January, 1st April and 1st September regardless of when school holidays fall).

The funding is currently set at £10 per session (2 hours), for five sessions a week, as long as these sessions are on different days. The funding is comparable with the funding school nurseries receive per part time pupil. Your child is permitted to attend each setting for the two hours a day free of charge but if the session is longer than two hours and you wish your child to stay for the full session available, you will be required to pay a top-up fee.

School Essentials Grant

Families on lower incomes and who receive certain benefits can claim £125 per child per year to help with school costs. Because of the extra cost families might face when their children start secondary school, £200 is available for pupils going into year 7.

The grant can be used to pay for:

- school uniform, including coats and shoes
- school activities, like learning a musical instrument, sports kit and equipment for after school activities
- classroom essentials, like pens, pencils and bags.

Families of children receiving Universal Primary Free School Meals should still check their eligibility for support so they can get the School Essentials Grant.

Families must register their eligibility for the grant through the council, they won't get it automatically. Their school will also get extra funding through the Pupil Development Grant, which they can use to provide additional support for children from lower income families.
