a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

THE PREMISES OWNER AND DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR (DPS), MUCAHIT ALTINSOY, IS COMMITTED TO UPHOLDING ALL FOUR LICENSING OBJECTIVES. THE PREMISES ARE SECURED 24/7 WITH A FULLY MONITORED ALARM SYSTEM AND A COMPREHENSIVE CCTV SYSTEM THAT IS REMOTELY VIEWABLE VIA A DEDICATED APPLICATION. STAFF WILL MAINTAIN OPEN COMMUNICATION WITH THE POLICE AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO ADDRESS ANY POTENTIAL ISSUES PROACTIVELY.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

A PROFESSIONAL REMOTELY VIEWABLE 24/7 CCTV SYSTEM, WITH SIX CAMERAS COVERING ALL PUBLIC AREAS INCLUDING ENTRY AND EXIT POINTS, IS INSTALLED. RECORDINGS WILL BE MAINTAINED FOR A MINIMUM OF 180 DAYS AND MADE AVAILABLE TO THE POLICE AND RELEVANT AUTHORITIES UPON REQUEST. THE PREMISES ARE PROTECTED BY A FULLY MONITORED ALARM SYSTEM FOR IMMEDIATE RESPONSE TO ANY POTENTIAL THREATS. STAFF WILL OPERATE CHALLENGE 25 POLICY FOR THE SALE OF ALCOHOL, WITH STRICT REFUSAL TO SERVE INTOXICATED PERSONS.

c) Public safety

THE PREMISES COMPLY WITH ALL RELEVANT FIRE SAFETY AND BUILDING REGULATIONS. CLEAR AND UNOBSTRUCTED ESCAPE ROUTES ARE MAINTAINED AT ALL TIMES, WITH ADEQUATE EMERGENCY LIGHTING. THE PREMISES ARE EQUIPPED WITH SMOKE DETECTORS AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS IN ADDITION TO A STANDARD FIRE DETECTION AND ALARM SYSTEM TO ENSURE THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF ALL OCCUPANTS.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

STAFF WILL ENSURE THAT CUSTOMERS LEAVING THE PREMISES DO SO QUIETLY, WITH CLEAR SIGNAGE REQUESTING CONSIDERATION FOR LOCAL RESIDENTS. ANY RECORDED MUSIC WILL BE KEPT AT BACKGROUND LEVELS TO PREVENT DISTURBANCE TO NEARBY PROPERTIES. DOORS AND WINDOWS WILL BE KEPT CLOSED WHEN MUSIC IS PLAYING TO MINIMISE NOISE ESCAPE.

e) The protection of children from harm

THE SALE OF ALCOHOL WILL BE STRICTLY PROHIBITED TO ANYONE UNDER THE AGE OF 18. STAFF WILL BE RIGOROUSLY TRAINED ON AGE VERIFICATION PROCEDURES AND WILL IMPLEMENT THE CHALLENGE 25 POLICY. PROMINENT NOTICES WILL BE DISPLAYED REGARDING THE LEGAL AGE FOR PURCHASING ALCOHOL. CHILDREN WILL ONLY BE PERMITTED ON THE PREMISES WHEN ACCOMPANIED BY A RESPONSIBLE ADULT.

 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a

school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

- 5. For example (but not exclusively), where the activity will occur on additional days during the summer months.
- 6. For example (but not exclusively), where you wish the activity to go on longer on a particular day e.g. Christmas Eve.
- 7. Please give timings in 24 hour clock (e.g. 16.00) and only give details for the days of the week when you intend the premises to be used for the activity.
- 8. If you wish people to be able to consume alcohol on the premises, please tick 'on the premises'. If you wish people to be able to purchase alcohol to consume away from the premises, please tick 'off the premises'. If you wish people to be able to do both, please tick 'both'.
- 9. Please give information about anything intended to occur at the premises or ancillary to the use of the premises which may give rise to concern in respect of children, regardless of whether you intend children to have access to the premises, for example (but not exclusively) nudity or semi-nudity, films for restricted age groups or the presence of gaming machines.
- 10. Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
- 11. The application form must be signed.
- 12. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
- 13. Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
- 14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.

Right to work/Immigration status

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership which is not a limited liability partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways:

- 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents which an applicant may provide to demonstrate their entitlement to work in the UK (which do not need to be certified) that are published on GOV.UK and in guidance issued under section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a cop of original documents, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be shared digitally. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copies of documents as set out above.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.
