The applicant has extensive experience in organising and delivering large-scale outdoor music and entertainment events and has a proven track record of complying with all licensing objectives. On-site parking and camping facilities will be provided as identified on the site plan, with further detail included within the Event Management Plan, which will be submitted to Monmouthshire County Council's Event Safety Advisory Group (ESAG) as part of pre-event consultation.

Operating Procedures and Licence Conditions

- The premises licence is restricted to four consecutive days from Thursday to Sunday in May or June of each year.
- The Licensee shall operate and maintain an up-to-date incident book detailing the time, date, individuals involved and a description of any incident. This incident book shall be made available for inspection by any Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003.
- Fully documented staff training on the premises license conditions including the Challenge 25 Policy shall be provided prior to each event.
- Staff shall sign and date training records to confirm that they have received and fully understood the training provided. These records shall be made available for inspection by any Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003.
- The premises license is limited to four consecutive event days per calendar year and to a maximum capacity of fewer than 5,000 persons.

Event Management Plan

- A detailed Event Management Plan (EMP) shall be prepared by the license holder and submitted to the ESAG at least 12 weeks before the start of an event. The EMP will cover all aspects of event planning including but not limited to:
- Site Plan
- Crowd Management and Security Plan
- Traffic Management Plan
- Noise Management Plan
- Event Safety Plan
- Health and Safety Policy
- Adverse Weather Plan
- Show Stop Procedures
- Medical Operations Plan
- Child & Vulnerable Person Protection Policy
- Welfare Management Plan
- Bars and Alcohol Management Plan
- Fire Management Plan
- Event Risk Assessment
- The EMP will be treated as a live document and updated following pre-event consultation and discussions with the ESAG. It must be agreed at least 14 days prior to the event.
- All licensable activities at the event shall be carried out in accordance with the approved EMP, which will form part of the operating plan for the premises.
- A designated member of the management team shall patrol the site to ensure that all control measures identified in risk assessments are implemented. Where new risks to safety are identified, the designated person will take the necessary steps to reduce or eliminate those risks.
- Plans showing planned temporary structures, stages, sponsor activities, bars, sanitary facilities, car parks and camping areas shall be submitted no later than three months before the event with an updated version submitted with the agreed EMP.

• For each event, the applicant will follow the principles contained within "The Event Safety Guide – A Guide to Health, Safety and Welfare at Music and Similar Events (HSG195)," published by the Health and Safety Executive (HSE, 1999, ISBN 07176 2453), and will operate in accordance with the recommendations of "The Purple Guide."

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- The Licensee shall ensure that trained members of staff are available during licensable hours. Where there is a risk of Class A, B, or C controlled substances (as defined under the Misuse of Drugs Act) or weapons being carried, the Licensee shall ensure that SIA-licensed security staff carry out random searches of outer clothing, pockets, and bags of persons seeking entry to the premises. If controlled substances or weapons are found, staff must inform the police as soon as reasonably practicable and record the incident in the incident book.
- The Licensee shall ensure that documented procedures are in place to discourage the use or sale of controlled substances on the premises, including documented checks of toilet areas throughout the event.
- The Licensee will operate a zero-drug policy, and all staff will receive appropriate training on this policy.
- All crime-related incidents shall be reported to the police as soon as reasonably practicable. Any disorder shall also be recorded in the incident log.

Security Staffing

- The Licensee shall conduct a risk assessment for each event to determine the required number of volunteer security marshals and SIA-licensed security supervisors.
- During events, volunteer marshals, supplemented by SIA-licensed supervisors, shall be deployed. A minimum ratio of one volunteer marshal per 250 attendees will be maintained throughout festival site opening hours.

c) Public safety

- Duly authorised officers of the council, Police Constables and duly authorised officers of South Wales Fire and Rescue Service shall, at all reasonable times, have free access to the licensed premises. The Licensee shall comply with any reasonable safety measures required by any duly authorised officer of the Council.
- The Licensee and all attendants shall take appropriate precautions to prevent accidents.
- Any outbreak of fire, however small, shall be reported immediately to the Fire Brigade.

Lighting and Electrical Installations

- All electrical fittings, wiring, and appliances shall be constructed and maintained in a safe and satisfactory condition to the satisfaction of the council. Whenever required by the council, the Licensee shall submit a certificate from a qualified electrical engineer confirming that all electrical installations have been examined, tested, and found to be in safe working order.
- The Licensee shall ensure that socket outlets used for temporary or portable electrical equipment on or near any stage area—together with any circuits associated with spotlights or other stage equipment—are protected by one or more Residual Current Devices (RCDs), as appropriate, with adequate load capacity and a maximum tripping current of 30 mA.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Noise Management

- A Noise Management Plan shall be submitted to the council's environmental health department a minimum of 28 days prior to the event.
- A letter shall be circulated to local residents at least two weeks before the event, providing event details, including start and finish times for both the event and any sound checks. The letter shall also include a dedicated telephone number for noise complaints, which will also be made available online.
- A dedicated telephone complaints line shall operate for the duration of each event. If any noise complaints are received, a suitably qualified acoustic consultant shall investigate the complaint. Where noise levels exceed those specified in the event-specific Noise Management Plan, immediate action shall be taken to reduce noise at the source.
- A complaints log shall be maintained throughout the event, detailing the address if ascertainable from which each complaint originates, the time received, and any actions taken.
- Site design: a suitably qualified acoustic consultant shall liaise with the event organisers, the sound system supplier, and the local authority to review site plans and determine the most appropriate layout to minimise noise impact at off-site locations.

Sound Systems

- The appointed acoustic consultant shall review all sound systems and other noise sources and work collaboratively with the promoter and the council to minimise noise disturbance.
- All sound system suppliers shall be informed of the strict noise management requirements, including the type, location, and orientation of their systems. Their hire contracts shall specify that overall control of sound levels rests with the venue and/or its appointed acoustic consultant.
- A consultant shall carry out both on-site and off-site sound monitoring throughout the festival, and monitoring records shall be retained for future inspection.

e) The protection of children from harm

The Licensee shall operate and maintain an up-to-date refusals register, recording all refusals of the sale of alcohol. The register shall include the date, time, and reason for each refusal and shall be made available for inspection by any Responsible Authority under the Licensing Act 2003. The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) shall sign the register each time it is checked.

The Licensee shall operate a Challenge 25 policy. Clear and prominent signage shall be displayed to indicate that this policy is in operation. All staff shall request photographic identification from any person who appears to be under the age of 25. Acceptable forms of identification shall be limited to:

- a valid passport
- a photographic driving licence
- a PASS-approved proof of age card (such as CitizenCard)
- an HM Forces identity card
- an EU-issued identity card bearing the holder's photograph and date of birth.

No other forms of identification shall be accepted.

All staff involved in alcohol sales shall receive training prior to each event on the prevention of underage sales. Records of this training shall be maintained and made available for inspection upon request.

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NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the
 holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their
 stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
 indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in
 combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their
 name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.

- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be checked online. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copy documents as set out above.

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NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific **regulated entertainments** please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
