

## SECTION 14 - ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

### MONMOUTHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (R1 BRYNARW TO LLANTHONY WOOD, CWMYOY, MONMOUTHSHIRE) EMERGENCY TRAFFIC REGULATION NOTICE 2026

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that **MONMOUTHSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL** of County Hall, The Rhadyr, Usk, NP15 1GA ("the Council") pursuant to the powers conferred by Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 makes the following provisions:

1. The closure shall come into operation on the **30<sup>th</sup> January 2026** and will remain in force for a period of 21 days or until the highway is made safe whichever is the earlier. We foresee that the works will require a longer period and that this notice will need to be extended into a temporary traffic regulation order.
2. The notice is necessary **for the reasons of public safety due to a large landslip.**
3. The effect of the notice will be to temporarily close a section of the **R1 Brynarw to Llanthony Wood, Cwmyoy, Monmouthshire**, ~410m from its junction with the Cwmyoy Road for ~390m.
4. A signed diversion route is in place as follows: **R1 Brynarw to Llanthony Wood, R5 Cwm Road, R4 Pont Esgob Farm to Middle Bettws Farm, Old Hereford Road, Pen-Y-Pound, A40, A479, A438, B4350, Forest Road, C0079 From Junction by New Forest Farm to Forest Road, C0079 from Gospel Pass to junction by New Forest Farm, C0079 From County Boundary by Capel-Y-Ffin to Gospel Pass, R1 Llanthony Wood to Capel-Y-Ffin and vice versa.**
5. This may be cited as **R1 Brynarw to Llanthony Wood, Cwmyoy, Monmouthshire** Emergency Traffic Regulation Notice 2026.
6. By virtue of Section 16(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 a person who contravenes a restriction or prohibition imposed under Section 14 of the Act shall be guilty of an offence.
